



טָרֵם יִשְׁכָּבוּ

TE-rem yish-KA-vu, before they went to sleep (the angels who came to Lot).

Two things to note. both words are pronounced MILEIL, accented on the next to the last syllable of the word.

However, the Torah notes - ZARKA & SEGOL - are each above the last letter of the words, even though those letters (or syllables) are NOT accented, as is usually the case with Torah notes.

There are a few other notes that traditionally are printed at the left end of the word, regardless of how the word is accented.

There are some Chumashim that try to avoid confusion by repeating the note on the accented syllable, טָרֵם יִשְׁכָּבוּ
