In this chart, Shabbat M'vorchim is shaded in light green and is followed by a box indicating when Rosh Chodesh is, when the molad occurs, the first opportunity for Kiddush L'vana according to Minhag Yerushalayim, which is after 3 full days following the molad [GRA] • first opportunity for the opinion that waits until 7 days after the molad (some hold that you can shorten the 7D rule a bit if it means KL on Motza"Sh) [7D] • and the last opportunity to say KL [last]. Note: In general, we do not say KL on Leil Shabbat or Yom Tov. However, when the last opportunity falls on Leil Shabbat or Leil Yom Tov, Kiddush L'vana may (and should) be said.
